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## WHAT'S NEW IN COLLABORATION SERVICES 3.0

As a result of ongoing research and development efforts, and in response to customer feedback, the following features having been added to version 3.0 of Quest Collaboration Services:

### **Extended Collaboration to Include Calendar Details**

With Collaboration Services, customers are now able to collaborate beyond just Free/Busy information. We've provided customers the ability to share calendar details as well.

### **Enhanced Support for Exchange Server 2007 Free/Busy Information**

With Microsoft Exchange Server 2007, the dependency on leveraging Public Folders for storage of Free/Busy information was no longer necessary. Due to this architectural change, Collaboration Services 2.0.X was limited in its support of Free/Busy information for Exchange Server 2007. However, with Collaboration Services 3.0, this limitation has been addressed.

### **Flexibility in Defining Stub-Object Location**

Previous versions of Collaboration Services, would store all stub-objects in a single Organizational Unit. With customers having more than a single synchronization partner, there was a need to allow more flexibility in how and where stub-objects are created. With Collaboration Services 3.0, customers can control what OUs are used for the default locations on a per synchronization partner basis or have sub-OUs automatically created.

### **Enhanced and Extended Contact Mapping Capabilities**

Based on customer feedback, the contact mapping capabilities needed to be enhanced to follow property creation rules similar to a regular stub object and Extended Attributes needed to be available for synchronization. These capabilities have been added in Quest Collaboration Services version 3.0.

### **Improved Troubleshooting for Non-Applied Object Queue**

During initial synchronization, objects that require further troubleshooting are displayed in the Non-Applied Object Queue. Customers requested the ability to export this data to a file so it can be shared with others to expedite the troubleshooting process. In Quest Collaboration Services version 3.0 it is now possible to export data in this way.
