<p>(a) When software is designed to run on a system that has a keyboard, product functions shall be executable from a keyboard where the function itself or the result of performing a function can be discerned textually.</p>	<p>Supported with minor exceptions: Keyboard access is provided throughout Exchange Migration Wizard and its help system. Keyboard shortcuts, shortcut keys, and menu commands are readily available. Exchange Migration Wizard also supports the on-screen keyboard access.</p>	<p>Minor exceptions in Exchange Migration Wizard involve limited number of commands for which the hot-keys are defined. Most of these occurrences are often solved by minor workarounds like selecting a command from a global menu. Exchange Migration Wizard also has the ability to add new icons to a toolbar that represent the commands and assign the shortcuts to the commands.</p>
<p>(b) Applications shall not disrupt or disable activated features of other products that are identified as accessibility features, where those features are developed and documented according to industry standards. Applications also shall not disrupt or disable activated features of any operating system that are identified as accessibility features where the application programming interface for those accessibility features has been documented by the manufacturer of the operating system and is available to the product developer.</p>	<p>↴ Supported with minor exceptions: Exchange Migration Wizard supports most accessibility settings of the operating system and in no case disrupts or disables any accessibility features of the operating system. Exchange Migration Wizard supports large and extra large fonts in the title bar, toolbars and most dialogs. However, large fonts are not supported in the right-hand pane when HTML pages are displayed (such as Resource Kit utilities launch screen and statistical information pages).</p>	<p>Exceptions are features that do not support large font settings or high contrast settings. These features are documented in 1194.21(g).</p>
<p>(c) A well-defined on-screen indication of the current focus shall be provided that moves among interactive interface elements as the input focus changes. The focus shall be programmatically exposed so that Assistive Technology can track focus and focus changes.</p>	<p>↴ Supported with minor exceptions: TOAD supports technologies that make computer programs more accessible to people who use Assistive Technology. TOAD fully supports Windows Appearance Properties to provide visual on-screen focus and tracking throughout.</p>	
<p>(d) Sufficient information about a user</p>	<p>↴ Supported with minor exceptions:</p>	

<p>interface element including the identity, operation and state of the element shall be available to Assistive Technology. When an image represents a program element, the information conveyed by the image must also be available in text.</p>	<p>Exchange Migration Wizard's User Interface elements include menu bars, toolbars, check boxes and buttons, to name a few. All the elements have a tooltip text.</p>	
<p>(e) When bitmap images are used to identify controls, status indicators, or other programmatic elements, the meaning assigned to those images shall be consistent throughout an application's performance.</p>	<p>Supported: Exchange Migration Wizard utilizes standard and consistent images throughout. All toolbar and menu images also utilize tooltip text to further convey their meaning. Exchange Migration Wizard has the customization features like the ability to add the icons to a toolbar and create new toolbars. The size of the icons displayed on a toolbar is also can be changed to large.</p>	
<p>(f) Textual information shall be provided through operating system functions for displaying text. The minimum information that shall be made available is text content, text input caret location, and text attributes.</p>	<p>Supported: Exchange Migration Wizard uses standard system functions to send textual information to the operating system in all cases.</p>	
<p>(g) Applications shall not override user selected contrast and color selections and other individual display attributes.</p>	<p>↓ Supported with minor exceptions: Exchange Migration Wizard supports large fonts in the title bar, toolbars, and in all dialogs except the HTML-formatted pages which display either the statistical information or the links to Resource Kit utilities. Exchange Migration Wizard also supports Microsoft Windows accessibility features, such as Magnifier, in the content display frame.</p>	<p>Exchange Migration Wizard may not support large font mode in dialogs where large fonts would render the dialog impossible to read. The operating system magnifier application is available to magnify all dialog texts.</p>
<p>(h) When animation is displayed, the information shall be displayable in at least one non-animated presentation mode at the option of the user.</p>	<p>Supported: Exchange Migration Wizard does not use animation to display critical information to the user.</p>	

<p>(i) Color coding shall not be used as the only means of conveying information, indicating an action, prompting a response, or distinguishing a visual element.</p>	<p>Supported: Exchange Migration Wizard does not use color as the only means to convey information, indicating an action or prompting a response.</p>
